Clearfield's Running, Passing Attack Sharp; Krolock, Duck Score 2

OSCEOLA MILLS—If last night's football exhibition at Osceola Mills is any indication of how Clearfield Area High's Bisons are going to play in the future this season, Clearfield opponents will certainly know they're wrapped up in a ball game. Last night before a good-sized, but not extraordinary gathering of fans, the seemingly-sturdy Bison grid machine of Coach Marty Koons rolled to an impressive opening victory, a decisive 38 to 0 triumph over Osceola Mills of Coach Leo Sticinski. The Bison offensive unit was thunderous while the defense, although a bit shaggy in spots, stopped the offensive attack of the Indians.

Tom Krolock, veteran senior fullback, and senior end Eugene Duck led the touchdown parade each with a pair of TD's. The other two were scored by Russ Triponey and Vic Jones, both backfieldmen. Dick Mitchell and Chuck Lewis each converted once by placement.

Defensive standouts in tackling for Clearfield were Chuck Lewis, Jones, Duck, Bill Chase, Glenn Rees, Charlie Leggs, Dick Miller and Neal Turner. All were in on many tackles. Line-man Fred Plummer, Chase and Duck were sharp as blockers.

Osceola Mills won the coin toss and elected to receive. Jim Dixon returned Mitchell's opening kick back two yards to the 19-yard line. With diminutive Bernie Grundusky, Indian quarterback, carrying the offensive load, a pair of first downs were picked up and Osceola Mills drove to its own 47 before being stopped on a third down pass. Dan Fritz punted to the Clearfield 24 where Mitchell returned it to the 32.

Krolock and Dick Miller picked up a first down to the 45 before Mitchell raced 15 yards for another first down to the Indian 40-yard line. The Bisons fumbled on the following play and Frank Reams recovered on the Osceola Mills 34.

On third down Grundusky tried his passing talents, but the alert Triponey speared the "fat" pass on the 33 and scooted the entire distance into paydirt for the first Bison touchdown. Triponey's timing on the interception was at a pin-point level. Fritz blocked Mitchell's point after touchdown attempt.

Minutes later an Osceola Mills fumble on the Clearfield 49 resulted in the second Clearfield touchdown. Miller, who did a fine job as the Red and Black signal caller, recovered the loose bobbie. On the first play from scrimmage, Krolock, galloping Herd tailback, romped 51 yards for the second Bison touchdown. Krolock was given a good off tackle hole and he followed his secondary blocking in fine fashion. Mitchell converted by placement and the Bisons led, 13-0. Two plays later the first quarter ended.

After Osceola Mills failed to move in three downs, the Indians punted, but Mitchell's fumble of the high floating oval gave Osceola Mills possession on the Bison 37. Halfback Jim Dixon jumped on the loose ball. The Indians were stymied again after one first down and Fritz punted into the end zone, virtually setting up Clearfield's third TD. After the ball was brought out to the 20, a holding penalty by Clearfield nullified a fine run by Krolock and put the ball back deep in the Herd's territory, the eight-yard line, to be exact. Krolock, however, "moved out" again. His forward wall gave him a good hole, but his ability to shake off would-be tacklers was the deciding difference.

The 165-pounder sprinted 92 yards to paydirt, out-distancing several members of the Tribe backfield. Mitchell's extra point attempt went off to the side, but Clearfield had a comfortable 19-0 lead.

Clearfield's fourth touchdown was set up following an Osceola punt which Mitchell returned to his own 37 from the 30. Jones, a newcomer to Clearfield football this year, showed good form when he first picked up four yards to the 41 before scampering 28 on a pitch out to the Osceola Mills 31.

After Mitchell cut back to the 28, Jones toted the pigskin to the 22 and the 17 before Miller passed to Lenny Moore for seven yards on the 10. Jones' turn came again, this time off right tackle—the whole way carrying a couple tacklers into the end zone. After Mitchell's kick was low, the score read 25-0 at half time.

Jones returned the opening second half kick back 20 yards to the 33, where Clearfield began another touchdown march. Krolock carried 15 yards to the 48 and a neat Miller pitchout netted nine yards to the Osceola Mills 43. On a quarterback sneak Miller picked up a first down to the 38 before Duane Tobias passed beautifully to Duck, who was all alone beyond the enemy, and the hustling Herd end raced to paydirt. Clearfield led 32-0 after Lewis kicked the extra point.

Triponey set up the final Clearfield touchdown when he recovered an Indian fumble on Clearfield's 46-yard line, fairly late in the third stanza. After a pass play resulted in a seven-yard loss, Krolock galloped 30 yards for a first down on Osceola's 31. With Krolock, Lewis, Gary Thomas, Jones and Bill Leggs each carrying a play, the ball was on the Indians' seven with fourth down and goal to go. Tobias then buck passed to Duck, who fought his way over for a touchdown. Lewis missed the extra point and Clearfield had registered 38 points.

There were no serious threats in the fourth period and when the game ended, Clearfield held possession on the Osceola Mills 24 following a 20-yard run by Krolock. Lewis and Bill Leggs each had fine runs in the fourth period, Lewis going for 35 yards and Leggs for 20.

Clearfield's substitutes played the final quarter with the exception of the last minute when Coach Koons was forced to send in the starting eleven because of a bit of roughness or "wild play."

Bellwood splurged with 18 points in the first quarter and added a touchdown in each of the remaining three stanzas. A 27-yard run through center by Ron Hampton gave the Golden Eagles their only score. Mike Kobak converted for the extra point.

Dillen ran 49, 30 and 67 yards for TD's and passed to Max Kneidinger for a 34-yard touchdown and to Fred Maurer for a 14-yard score. Dillen also climaxed a long Bellwood-Antis drive by plunging over from one yard out.
